Plot of the opera


The great protagonist of the novel is Kairienè the black on the threshold of the ruined house in her village is to continue the memory of her husband and son.

Against the backdrop of suffering inflicted by the Soviet dictatorship, with the dispossession of property and land as a result of collectivization, for many, many years the people of the village are subjected by the miserable allowance coming from the world of kolkoz.

After the collapse of modernity erase peasant lifestyle, appearing cars roaring on freshly paved roads, the relationship between the men are rough, down the dark incommunicability.

Theme of the work

"Life under the maple is a novel focusing on memory, memory for rescue stories, facts and figures that would be forgotten. And in a world where memory becomes necessary to fill a huge void, the author offers us a fine metaphor for the greed of mankind.



The author

Romualdas Granauskas, journalist (radio and TV) and professor, is author of numerous short stories, plays, screenplays and novels (The sacrifice of the bull, 1975, a white crown on a black locomotive, 1987, 1987 Life under the maple).

One of the most important writers of so-called "Rebirth of Lithuania." His works were never translated, so far Granauskas had appeared only in journals. Besa publisher, publishing Life under the maple tree, break the silence on an important author of our times.

"Life under the maple tree" is an easy book to read but terribly sad. The approach with the Lithuanian author, who I did not know, Romualdas Granauskas, was intriguing. Melancholy and deeply nostalgic, never repetitive but accurate in details, the writer has brought me in eternal journey of memory, one for me and essential value of life. The novel "Life under the maple tree" seems more a diary than a story. The country life has been completely erased and she, Monika Kairiené, the protagonist, is the last link. Kairiené in that corner of the earth finds history, still warm, the coming of spring, of snow while the grass grows green, a village not yet destroyed of long evenings at home of Onelè, especially maple sprouting above the roof. Romualdas Granauskas, pours in the story teaspoons of Lithuania peasant. There isn't an excitement in the narrative of the past, but the intensity of memory that is lifeblood. Reading the pages of the book, run in front of me eyes of many older women of the East, in recent years have populated our cities. These women, sad-eyed and inquisitive, have admired our economic welfare but have an intense pride in their traditions. Strong was the regret of hot soup shared with the whole family after a day of hard work and parties lived with the participation of the whole community.
